## GENERAL CLUB INFORMATION

- The purpose of the Rogue Gem & Geology Club is to foster healthful fellowship among its members while pursuing the activities and knowledge of the earth sciences, and to serve the community by introducing its young people and adults to the wonders of the mineral world.
- Regular meetings are held the first Wednesday of each month at the Fruitdale Grange, 1440 Parkdale Dr., Grants Pass. Meetings begin at 7:00, and Guests are always welcome. Potluck meals are scheduled for March & June, September Picnic, December, Christmas Party.
- Members are entitled to use the equipment and join in the classes that are available at the clubhouse located at 1003 Isham, Grants Pass. There are shop fees applied to use of equipment and materials. Some classes may have a small fee for materials.
- One day field trips are held several times through the year on Saturdays or Sundays following the club meeting. A once a year extended field trip is usually held each June.
- New Membership dues of \$26.00 per (immediate) family. This includes one plastic badge and the Newsletter, "Gems of the Rogue". Additional member badges \$6.00 each. Club year runs September 1<sup>st</sup> through August 31<sup>st</sup>. Renewal dues are then \$ 20.00 per year and payable September 1<sup>st</sup>. Individual junior (youth ages 12-18) membership dues are \$7.00 per year.
- Every member is asked to volunteer a minimum of 16 hours per year, as stated in the club By-laws.
- We exchange Newsletters with other clubs at no charge.
- Deadline to submit articles in the Newsletter is the 2nd Friday of the month.
- Permission to reprint material from the Newsletter is granted provided due credit is given.

Members are allowed to take one rock from the club each week for free. Additional rocks may be purchased for 10cents /lb. for members, when the club is open.

Members may also purchase slabs from the shop during open club hours.

## **Board Meeting Minutes September 16, 2020**

President Susan Szabo called the meeting to order at 1:30.

Meeting postponed from last week due to fires in the area.

Jill Dugan made a motion to accept the minutes of the last Board Meeting as written. Jan Arnold seconded. Motion passed

**Treasurer** Nancy Rogers was absent but reported the Operating Account has \$22932.63, Building \$34114.10 and the square account \$408.17.

**Gary Ruehling** gave a report on the Yard Sale. Attendance was good and he has \$182.00 to give the Treasurer. 8 members renewed at the garage sale and 3 new families signed up. He requested that we plan to do it again next year, Labor Day Weekend. It will go on the calendar. He thanked all the members who stepped in and helped at the sale. The club needs a Sales Chairman.

**Jim Hawkins** reported he purchased all the supplies the Board approved last month. These included Mineral oil, synthetic oil, and saw blades. He requested permission to buy grit because the supply is getting low. He also requested permission to buy 2 to 4 heaters for the shop and upstairs this winter. He received permission to buy these supplies. Money for the heaters to come from the Building Fund.

**The building** needs some siding repairs and painting. Jim Hawkins suggested we do it ourselves. Susan Szabo suggested we put it in the newsletter that we need a volunteer coordinator to spearhead this job and volunteers to do the actual work.

**Jim Hawkins** said he has filed the end of year report for the claims. He is still working on a few other claim issues. No work can be done on the claims until the fire danger is over. He is still working on getting the trail built for the Harry Winters claim. We have a member who has an excavator the club could use but we would need insurance and a licensed bonded operator. Members are being asked if they know any contractors who are licensed, bonded and insured the club might consider hiring to do the clearing.

**Michelle Wheeler**, Membership reported lots of members are not renewing. Please consider sending your dues in the mail to renew.

**Carol Williams** is working on a few Field Trips. Hopefully the fire danger will be over soon and we can go somewhere.

**Trish Hepburn** said New Bylaw changes have been approved by the Board but are waiting for a General Meeting so the membership can vote.

**Jim Hawkins** reported he has posted Safety Guidelines in the Silver Room.

The fire extinguishers at the club need to be replaced or recharged.

**Dale Wheeler's Memorial** will be Friday September 18 at Hillcrest Memorial at 11:00.

**The October General Meeting is cancelled.**

**Ads are available** to purchase in the Newsletter if any member is interested.

**Trish Hepburn and Michelle Wheeler** agreed to be Calendar Coordinators for the club. They will make sure all classes get on the Calendar and there are hopefully no conflicts.

**New Faceting classes** will begin in October. October 5, Monday, Bill Boeh will start a beginning faceting class from 8 to 12. October 5, Zoltan Szabo will start an intermediate faceting class meeting from 1 to 5. The beginning class is free.

The intermediate class has a cost of \$15.00. Sign up sheets available at the club house.

**The club is looking** for a volunteer to be Program coordinator. Responsibility will be to arrange a speaker for most General Meetings, to speak for about 15 minutes on a rock related topic.

**Thursday night classes** will start again in October. October 8<sup>th</sup> will be hammered bracelets and October 22<sup>nd</sup> will be bottle cap flowers. Jim Hawkins will be teaching a **cabbing class** on the same Thursday nights. This means the shop will not be open for members on those nights.
