GENERAL CLUB INFORMATION

- The purpose of the Rogue Gem & Geology Club is to foster healthful fellowship among its members while pursuing the activities and knowledge of the earth sciences, and to serve the community by introducing its young people and adults to the wonders of the mineral world.
- Regular meetings are held the first Wednesday of each month at the Fruitdale Grange, 1440 Parkdale Dr., Grants Pass. Meetings begin at 7:00, and Guests are always welcome. Potluck meals are scheduled for March & June, September Picnic, December, Christmas Party.
- **Members** are entitled to use the equipment and join in the classes that are available at the clubhouse located at 1003 Isham, Grants Pass. There are shop fees applied to use of equipment and materials. Some classes may have a small fee for materials.
- One day field trips are held several times through the year on Saturdays or Sundays following the club meeting. A once a year extended field trip is usually held each June.
- New Membership dues of \$28 per (immediate) family. This includes one plastic badge and our monthly Newsletter, "Gems of the Rogue". Additional member badges \$8 each. Club year runs September 1st through August 31st. Renewal dues are still \$20 per year and payable September 1st.
- •Every member is asked to volunteer a minimum of 16 hours per year, as stated in the club By-laws.
- •We exchange Newsletters with other clubs at no charge.
- Deadline to submit articles in the Newsletter is the 3rd Wednesday of the month.
- Permission to reprint material from the Newsletter is granted provided due credit is given.

Members are allowed to take one rock from the club each week for free. Additional rocks may be purchased for 10cents /lb. for members, when the clubhouse is open. Slabs can be purchased at the shop.

Members may also purchase slabs from the shop during open club hours.

Our club is operated by volunteers. There are no paid positions.
